



Safe Routes to Schools Alameda County

The Safe Routes to Schools Alameda County Partnership Program is a countywide collaboration to promote safe walking and biking to school and reduce traffic congestion in the areas surrounding schools throughout Alameda County. The partnership includes Transform, Alameda County Public Health Department (ACPHD), and Cycles of Change. Program components include:

“Walk and Roll” Puppet Show Assembly

- A 30 minute performance for K-5 students that delivers messages about pedestrian and bike safety, smart decision making, reducing pollution, and creating a strong and healthy community.

Walking School Bus

- A proven and tested method of encouraging children and families to walk to school in groups.

Bicycle PE Program

- Provided for 4-8th graders, this eight hour curriculum provides youth with bikes, helmets and instruction.

Walk Audits

- Identifies needed improvements for safer walking and biking routes to school.

Safe Routes to Schools Educator Guide

- Easy to teach standards-based lesson plans that include themes of pedestrian safety, community, and health.

Monthly Walk and Roll to School Days

- Provide support for organizing weekly or monthly walk and roll to school days.

ACPHD In-Class & School wide Pedestrian and Bicycle Safety Presentations

- Highly interactive presentations that discusses helmet safety, reinforces rules of the road, and how to build safety skills for pedestrians in urban environments.



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
